GRANTS

Our department has been awarded grants from the NH Office of Highway Safety. These grants will allow additional patrols aimed at stopping distracted drivers on our roadways. More specifically, our department will be looking for intoxicated drivers and drivers using their cell phones while operating a motor vehicle.

TRAINING

This quarter, officers attended training in deescalation techniques, ethics, implicit bias, handcuffing refresher, hazardous materials, hostage negotiation, and impaired driving, amongst others. Officers also conducted active shooter training at the Mont Vernon Village School. As we have stated in the past, training is a big focus of our department. Our officers continually train above and beyond the annual training requirements set forth by the state to ensure we have professional officers ready for any type of investigation, emergency, or crisis that may occur.
