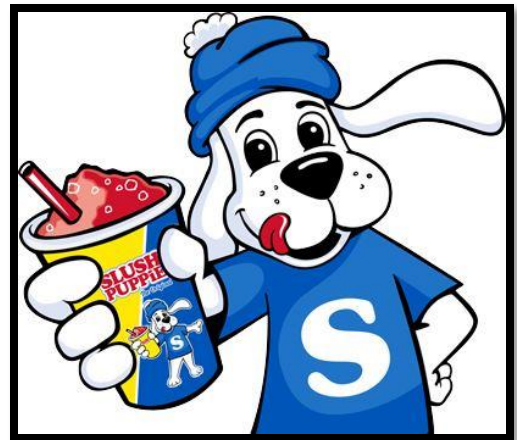


## THE MONT VERNON POLICE DEPARTMENT PARTICIPATED IN THE DEA'S DRUG TAKE-BACK DAY
